TO THE RESCUE



These animals needed protection from the anticipated flooding, and many were rescued from floodwaters during and after Irma. The shelters that housed these animals were desperate to make space for the large number of pets

who could be lost from their families and needed a local place where they could reunite once the storm and floodwaters passed.

This is when PAWS Humane sprang into action. Our organization was asked to take in dozens of cats and dogs from the north east coast of Florida. We immediately put out a request for donations of animal care supplies and the response from our community was overwhelming. Within hours, generous individuals from all over the Valley donated a large space to house the animals, food, blankets, toys and other needed items. We could not have helped these animals without the support of our very philanthropic community.

Mike Merrill, President of F.U.R. (Florida Urgent Rescue – an animal transport group out of Jacksonville, FL) stated, "Shelters in Florida are overwhelmed and we are so grateful that organizations like PAWS Humane have jumped in to help save lives." "Without help from groups like PAWS Humane, many of these dogs and cats would have no hope." Many of the animals arriving needed a lot from our organization. There are many underserved counties

throughout the U.S. that do not have the resources to provide even the most basic standard of care to their stray animal population. Taking these animals in can be risky business, but PAWS has the protocols in place to help mitigate risks and properly take care of their needs.

By the time our rescue efforts had ended, PAWS had taken in 39 dogs and 43 cats, and the wonderful news is that almost all were adopted within 3-4 weeks.

PAWS Humane's mission is to save animal lives and we will do all we can to help, just as we hope others would help us if we were in a similar situation.


In preparation for Hurricane Irma, transport rescues all across Florida and southern Georgia moved thousands of animals out to destination shelters all throughout the Eastern U.S.



STARTING OFF 2018 RIGHT!

Outreach and education have always been an important part of the PAWS Humane mission statement. Historically, however, our funds were primarily allocated to the veterinary clinic and adoptions. These activities address the most urgent and visible needs in our community. Yet there is quite a lot of behind the scenes work that must take place if we are ever going to achieve our vision of a "no-kill" community.

PAWS Humane has operated Pets for Life, an intensive community outreach



In 2015, there was no budget allocated to support a community outreach program coordinator, so our volunteer coordinator and I carved out hours from our already full schedules to make this program a reality. Through these efforts, PAWS Humane provided **1,200** spay/neuter surgeries to canines in a subsection of the 31907 zip code.



We could not have done this without a grant from Pet Smart Charities which funded the spay/neuter surgeries. In 2018, Pet Smart Charities is back with another grant to help us expand our Pets for Life program in Columbus. We now have a full time outreach coordinator working with volunteers in the neighborhoods which supply the greatest numbers of Columbus Animal Care and Control intakes. This is where we will finally win the war against pet overpopulation and the needless suffering that goes along with it.

In 2017, PAWS Humane also received a generous grant from the Petco Foundation to take over the community cat project that Best Friends Animal Society began in 2014. It is because of this program that the live release rate of cats at Columbus Animal Care and Control has gone from 10% to 92%.

The Best Friends project spayed and neutered more than **2,000** cats each year. Our goal is to maintain this level of activity for at least three more years. At that point we will evaluate our progress and determine the appropriate level of activity needed to maintain no-kill status.

These are exciting times for PAWS Humane and for Muscogee County when our vision of a no-kill community is quickly becoming a reality.

Each year millions of homeless dogs and cats are euthanized simply because too many animals come into the shelter and not enough people consider adopting. Are you just having issues with some bad habits and need advice? Shelters are often staffed with people who have years of experience so they can help you work through your problems.

NATIONAL POISON PREVENTION WEEK



Allow cleaning products to dry before allowing pets access to the area.

Make sure that candy is kept out of reach of your pets. Chocolate and xylitol (found commonly in sugar free gum) can be deadly. Avoid giving pets table food as some things, such as greasy foods, can cause pancreatitis. Feeding coconut oil has also been linked to causing pancreatitis and diarrhea. Keep plants outside or in a room where cats are not allowed. Even ingestion of a few leaves or petals can cause serious issues. Don't put insecticides or rodenticides in areas where other animals have free access to them.

The month of March highlights National Poison Prevention Week, March 18th-24th.

With spring right around the corner, there are many hidden dangers in your household that could be harmful to your pets. Being exposed to toxins is one of the main reasons many pets are taken to seek emergency care.

Top 10 most common toxins:

- Over the counter medications such as pain relievers, herbal supplements, vitamins, coconut oil, etc.
- Prescription drugs
- Insecticides
- **Human Foods** xylitol (found in sugar free items), grapes or raisins, onions, greasy foods, alcohol, and garlic.
- **Household Items** cleaning supplies, paint, potpourri, glow sticks, etc.
- Veterinary Medications incorrectly used off label
- Chocolate baking chocolate and dark chocolate have a higher toxicity
- Plants Lilies, Azaleas, Daffodils, Tulips, and Hyacinths, etc.
- Rodenticides rat poison
- Garden Products herbicides and fungicides

Stay Safe

Make sure all medications are kept in child proof bottles and kept in cabinets that are not accessible. Don't ever give your pet over the counter or prescription medication without first consulting your veterinarian. Use veterinary prescription drugs and flea medications as directed on the label. Do not apply dog flea medication to cats. Dog-specific insecticides containing pyrethrins are highly toxic to cats.

Keep cleaning products in cabinets enclosed in their containers. Wipe up all residue or extra liquid when finished.



What to do

If your pet should accidentally come into contact with any of these items, please contact your local veterinarian or the **Animal Poison Control Hotline (888)-426-4435** as soon as possible. Remember, the faster you get your pet help, the more favorable the outcome! Also make sure to have the package or bottle of the toxin available as it will help with treatment. Never try to treat your pet yourself as different toxins are treated differently.

Many of these products are also hazardous to children as well. So as you start your spring cleaning make sure and create a safe environment for you, your family, and your pets!

The training and transformation to become certified in Service Enterprise will take PAWS employees 18 months to complete and has been underway since July 20, 2017. "It has taken a lot of preparation and teamwork over the last 7 months, but we are seeing positive changes at PAWS Humane," says PAWS Volunteer and Foster Care Coordinator, Anitra Holley. "Not only have we been successful in recruiting more skilled, dedicated volunteers, our entire staff has been quite welcoming of the change. We can see the final vision taking form and are pleased at where our Volunteer Program is headed."

It only took a couple of days in Stephanie's home for Asher to start eating and playing like healthy, young dogs should. He bonded quickly with Stephanie's two larger, older dogs, initiating play and snuggling with them during naptime. Then he decided to trust Stephanie and her family enough to snuggle on the couch with them. Only a week into their foster experience with Asher, Stephanie said, "He's doing so good!....He plays with the big dogs and chases them, and has started to come to me when I



call him. It's amazing what a week in a loving home can do for a dog." We couldn't agree more.

After a month of showering him with love and attention, Asher's foster family became his forever family! Asher will never have to worry about where his next meal or hug will come from. The Taylor family is smitten with

him and committed for life. We couldn't have asked for a happier ending!

3RD ANNUAL BARKS AND BLUES FESTIVAL






